- 4. Mountain Line Updates
 - a. Service Expansion
 - i. Begins Sunday July 10th, first time public transportation will be operated on a Sunday in Montana
 - ii. The agency has doubled employee count in the last year, has remodeled building in anticipation of service expansion
 - iii. Starting July 10th
 - 1. M-F 5:45am 10:45pm
 - 2. Saturday 8:45 -10:45pm
 - 3. Sunday 8:45am 8:45pm
 - iv. When fixed route operating, paratransit has complementary services available.
 - b. Software Updates
 - i. Recently rolled out new fixed route app
 - Paratransit software will be updated next, this includes looking for volunteers to identify software bugs.
 - iii. Call in service will still be available, however new software will allow riders to schedule over app, review/ change schedule, and receive notifications. This also streamlines the process for Mountain Line staff.

i. Paratransit provides over 200 rides per day, staff has increased from

1 to 3 persons.
